THE PRESIDENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE

The Presidential Chain of Office was created in 1980 by Mary Sartor, M.F.A., University of Colorado, Boulder, for the inauguration of President Arnold R. Weber. The chain was a gift to the University by Mr. and Mrs. David G. Hawthorn, Class of '24.

Colorado gold and silver are used throughout the chain to symbolize the importance of those minerals to the history of the state. The gem stones chosen also consist entirely of minerals from Colorado.

Three pendants are suspended on the chain. The back pendant is the Seal of the State of Colorado surrounded by a golden ribbon representing the golden Circle of Knowledge. The top pendant in the front, the Seal of the University of Colorado surmounted by an arch set with diamond and topaz, signifies the necessary link between the search for knowledge and its practical application to the world outside the University. The Seal is supported at the bottom by the laurel wreaths found in the Seal, emblematic of honor and success.

The bottom pendant is centered with a golden topaz indicating man's quest for knowledge. The surrounding ring is paved with fragmented cubes and diamonds which suggest fragments of knowledge with brilliant breakthroughs of understanding.

The chain surrounding these pendants symbolized the endless but ever-changing cycle of human knowledge.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL

The University of Colorado has used three seals in its lifetime.


The present seal, adopted in 1908, depicts a classical Greek male figure seated against a pillar and holding a scroll. A burning torch framed in laurel is placed beside him. The Greek inscription means "Let your light shine."

According to Denver designer Henry Reed, the classical design was used because Greek civilization "stands as the criterion of culture." The laurel symbolizes honor or success, the youth of the figure suggests the "morning of life," and the scroll represents written language.

From 1893 to 1908, a seal was used which copies Wyon's medallion, "Science Trims the Lamp of Life." The classical figure of a kneeling Greek woman was flanked by mariposa lilies, which President Baker described as "a true Colorado flower."

Before 1893, a seal was used which essentially copies the Colorado state seal. It was never adopted by the Regents.

The official seal of the University of Colorado is used only by the Regents in transmitting official business.



THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the baccalaureate address by President George Norlin, of the University of Colorado, June 1935)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

This exercise denotes not your severance from her, but your union with her. Commencement does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into the fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

The University is not the campus, not the buildings on the campus, nor the faculties, nor the students of any one time — not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you go, the University goes with you. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

What the University purposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas — a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is its darkness! But if it shines in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship. I bid you farewell only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cape or mantle which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and in style of cap, gown and hood developed. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress. Today, the black gown, hood, and mortar board worn by the graduates in most institutions follow this code.

While it is not apparent to the casual observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipients are square at one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet, and facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who receive a master's or a doctoral degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctoral candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, is black and has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. Candidates for the baccalaureate degree wear the tassel pendant over the right front of the cap before the degree is conferred, then it is worn on the left side. *Summa Cum Laude* and special honors candidates will wear gold honor cords.

University Medal

JAMES C. BERGER

Few people are as deserving to receive the University Medal as James C. Berger. He is a great friend to the University and the ideal volunteer and partner for CU-Colorado Springs.

A business graduate of the University of Colorado at Boulder,

Berger has been involved in many roles over the years with the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. Currently, he is a member of the Chancellor's Roundtable and the University Real Estate Advisory Committee, was most recently appointed to the board of the CU Real Estate Foundation, and just finished a term on the CU-Colorado Springs Campaign Team.

His work in the real estate arena with the University and the Foundation is unsurpassed. He has represented and negotiated numerous gifts and transactions representing both the University and the Foundation. Jim's 40 plus years in the real estate business, combined with his passion for the University, have served CU-Colorado Springs very well. He negotiated a purchase to obtain a

parcel that completes the University's western campus, and in the process saved the University hundreds of thousands of dollars. He also has worked with the Foundation on transactions with individuals owning property adjacent to the campus, once again saving the University significant resources.

Most recently, Berger worked with the University, the Foundation, and the seller to purchase the former Compassion building on Cragwood Drive, now known as University Hall. This was a long negotiation that without Jim's expertise, skills, and solid community relationships might not have been successfully completed. His skills are rare in that he understands both the gift side and the business side of real estate and can use his knowledge to negotiate gifts and transactions very effectively.

In addition, Berger has been a long-time donor to the College of Business, and he and his wife have supported scholarships for the Reach Your Peak scholarship program in various areas of the University. He is always available to assist in any way he can.

With deep gratitude for his commitment and generous contribution of time, expertise, and resources, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is honored to present James C. Berger with the University Medal.



2003 Distinguished Service Award

BRENDA SMITH

Brenda Smith is a pioneer and stellar role model for women in the business sector. During the early 1970s, Smith began her college education part-time at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs while serving

as an office manager for a local CPA. Following graduation in 1978, Smith worked for Strait Kushinsky, which later merged with Baird, Kurtz and Dobson (BKD), today, the region's largest CPA firm. During her tenure at BKD, Smith has earned the position of Managing Partner.

Since graduating from CU-Colorado Springs, she has served on numerous boards and committees at all levels within the University. Over the past several years, she has assisted several Chancellors and Deans of the College of Business with a wide range of projects and their efforts to build an excellent educational institution. Frequently she has been called upon by the Chair of the Accounting and Finance Department to assist with departmental projects.

Smith's personal and professional accomplishments are testimony to her dedication and support of our campus and community. In 1988, she was named Outstanding Alumna for the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. In 1991, the business community honored Smith by naming her the first female chair of the Colorado Springs Chamber of Commerce.

Smith's vision and foresight were responsible for the formation of the premier leadership organization in the Pikes Peak region, the Colorado Springs Leadership Institute. Together with other leaders in the community, she also helped organize the Colorado Springs Chapter of Executive Women International (EWI) and the Chamber Nonprofit Center. She is one of the few women ever to serve on El Pomar Foundation Board of Trustees where she is a capable steward of the Spencer Penrose Legacy and quietly touches the lives of millions of Coloradoans.

In recognition of her many contributions to the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, the community, and the state, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is honored to present Brenda Smith with the Distinguished Service Award.

HONORARY DEGREES AND AWARDS



ALUMNI LEGISLATIVE AWARD (PRESENTED AT AN EARLIER CEREMONY)

ANDREW (ANDY) McElhany State Senator Andy McElhany is an ardent, longtime supporter of CU-Colorado Springs. During his four terms in office, he supported

the campus in important ways. In fact, even before he was sworn into the Legislature, he went before the Capital Development Committee and advocated for self-supporting residence halls at CU-Colorado Springs.

Senator McElhany was a galvanizing force behind other campus projects, including the expansion of the Kraemer Family Library, upgrades and renovations of Main Hall and those slated for Cragmor. He provided valuable support as the University moved forward with the purchase of University Hall, plans for the new parking garage and additional housing. He is also an advocate for the new role and mission for the campus.

Senator McElhany has consistently supported the University of Colorado and higher education issues. He is a leader in defining the relationship between higher education and the state's economic development and growth. He clearly understands the University's need to partner with the business community for purposes of maintaining excellence in both.

Senator McElhany, whose 12th District represents El Paso and Teller counties, was elected to the Colorado Senate in 2000. Before that, he served three terms in the Colorado House, from 1994 through 1998. He is the author of groundbreaking legislations, such as the "deadbeat parent" bill, which denied Driver's Licenses to parents for not paying child support. He also sponsored the bill repealing the Marriage Penalty Tax, which charges more in taxes to couples who are married than those who never said "I do."

He has crusaded for such issues as welfare reform, transportation, government efficiency, and tax reform. Senator McElhany currently chairs the Business Affairs and Labor Committee, and serves on the Capitol Development, and Education Committees.

The Alumni and Friends Association expresses its gratitude to Senator Andy McElhany for his commitment to the campus, the community, and to higher education. For all his efforts, CU-Colorado Springs is delighted to present him yet again, for the fourth straight year, with the 2003 Alumni Legislative Award.



2003 Honorary Doctor of Science

(PRESENTED AT AN EARLIER CEREMONY)

JOHN BENNETT HERRINGTON

Many CU-Colorado Springs alumni have gone far in life. But none has gone further than John Bennett Herrington, Math '83.

In November, Herrington made history aboard the space shuttle Endeavour, capping an illustrious more than 20-year career as a U.S. Navy aviator. Endeavour's seven-member crew traveled to Space Station Alpha with a mission of transporting a new three-member crew and returning three current space station occupants, including two Russians, to Earth. Herrington performed three space walks and installed a 29,000-pound truss to support various solar arrays. Herrington's flight was the last mission before the Columbia disaster, allowing him to become the country's first American Indian astronaut.

Herrington earned a bachelor's degree from CU-Colorado Springs in applied mathematics and attended the Navy's Aviation Officer Candidate School, graduating in 1984. In 1985, he was named a Navy aviator – a "Top Gun." He was a patrol plane instructor and commander, a mission commander, and a fleet replacement squadron instructor pilot before earning a master's degree in aeronautical engineering from the Navy Postgraduate School. In 1996, he was selected by NASA. Six years later, he traveled to space and became the first Native American to do so. He holds the rank of U.S. Navy commander.

On board the shuttle, Herrington brought a CU-Colorado Springs pennant and carried with him two symbols of his heritage, a Chickasaw Nation flag and eagle feathers given to him by several other tribal nations. The feathers represented strength and courage.

Herrington continues to be active in the American Indian Society of Engineering Students, visiting the campus AISES chapter in 1998 and 2003 and serving on the national organization's board of directors.

For his many achievements and significant contributions to his country and the University, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is proud to award John Bennett Herrington the degree of Doctor of Science, *honoris causa*.

Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters

SANDY F. KRAEMER

Sandy F. Kraemer is a Renaissance man whose achievements, service, and creativity demonstrate a wide range of interest and talents.

With a B.S. in engineering from Stanford University and a J.D.

from the University of Colorado School of Law, Kraemer has been a practicing lawyer in Colorado Springs since 1963. He was elected to the University of Colorado Board of Regents for a six-year term from Congressional District 5 in 1976, served as chair of the board 1982-83, and was re-elected for a second six-year term in 1982.


Throughout his twelve years of service as a CU Regent, he was a champion of minority recruitment and retention, financial accountability, energy conservation, and uniform student academic honor codes and conduct codes. He also was a strong advocate of CU-Colorado Springs and statewide efforts for

economic development and attracting industry to Colorado.

Kraemer's achievements include a long list of publications achieved while building a successful law practice. His concern over the environment and energy conservation led him to perform original work in what he characterized as "solar law," one of the first legal forays into this set of issues that helped enact new solar legislation in many states. Known as a lawyer's lawyer, he has added much to the body of law in Colorado and in the wider world.

His interests in philanthropy and estate planning resulted in a popular primer on estate planning, the establishment of a public charity to promote philanthropy, and generous charitable contributions to community institutions including an endowment for the CU-Colorado Springs Kraemer Family Library.

As a civic leader, a philanthropist, a dedicated supporter of the University of Colorado, and a remarkable free spirit who turned this attribute to productive ends, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is proud to award Sandy F. Kraemer the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.
