On behalf of the University of Colorado, I am pleased to offer my warmest congratulations to you in recognition of your achievement.



HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

WILLIAM L. ARMSTRONG

WILLIAM L. ARMSTRONG is one of Colorado's most outstanding public servants. He is revered in the state's business community and his nearly three decades of service in public office resulted in a record that proved he was truly a "citizen legislator."

He had the foresight and tenacity to author and pass the income tax indexing provision of the 1981 Reagan tax cut bill. Many experts regard the former senator's proposal as one of the most important tax reforms in decades.

William L. Armstrong was one of the youngest Senate majority leaders in Colorado history. As a politician, he built a reputation as a strong force on economic issues. He also was one of the Senate's leaders for international human rights - forcing legislation requiring a ban on imports produced by forced labor.

He began his career as a broadcaster in Fremont, Nebraska, and

was formerly president of the Colorado Springs Sun newspaper and Denver radio stations KOSI and KEZW. He led the effort to gain live, gavel-to-gavel radio and television coverage of the U.S. Senate's proceedings.

William L. Armstrong has made a career of service and leadership by living the virtues in which he believes. He exemplifies a successful community and public servant who places principles before politics, and morals before money.

He exemplifies all that decent people may accomplish through the employment of intellect, honesty, and conviction. For his service to the state of Colorado, the University of Colorado Board of Regents takes this opportunity to honor William L. Armstrong by awarding him the degree Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

**HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS
ELIZABETH WRIGHT INGRAHAM**

ELIZABETH WRIGHT INGRAHAM is a prize-winning architect in Colorado Springs and carries the prestige of her grandfather's legacy (Frank Lloyd Wright) to local concerns with the environment of the West. In addition to being a talented, practicing architect, she is a world-renowned educator, critic, and philosopher in the realm of the built environment. Elizabeth Wright Ingraham has always supported the professional development of younger architects, and has served on the faculty of the College of Environmental Design in Boulder. She seeks out youngsters of elementary school age who express interests in design and the environment to help foster their enthusiasm.

She responds unselfishly to frequent requests to serve as a visiting professor and lecturer at universities and throughout the world.

Through her architecture, she has demonstrated the sense of artistic sophistication that is respectful of the terrain, the ecological conditions of Colorado, and the change in culture that the Front Range has experienced during the past 30 years with the influx of population from both coasts. The Wright Ingraham Institute is a nonprofit agency in Colorado formed in 1971 to promote, direct, encourage, and develop opportunities contributing to the use of human and natural resources.

In recognition of her service as an educator and a guardian of the well-being of the environment, and to acknowledge the countless people she has inspired by her commitment to her profession, the CU Board of Regents is honored to present Elizabeth Wright Ingraham the degree Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

**UNIVERSITY MEDAL
JOSEPH PETTA**

JOSEPH PETTA is one of the founding fathers of the CU-Colorado Springs campus. While he was teaching at the CU Extension, he organized local citizens to petition for a permanent CU campus. His committee worked with Regents and state legislators to make the university a reality. He personally considers the establishment of this university his greatest contribution to the Colorado Springs community.

Because of his vision and dedication, thousands of students in Southern Colorado have experienced the benefits of a superior university education.

Joseph Petta earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Colorado, and his Ph.D., from LaSalle University.

He has spent four decades teaching throughout Southern Colorado, and he established the first college level degree granting program in 1967 for the Colorado Department of Corrections. He has served other institutions such as Pikes Peak Community College and Colorado State University as an adviser.

He also has served on the St. Francis Hospital Board of Directors and was president of the board when much of the physical plant was replaced.

In celebration and recognition of his dedication to providing educational opportunities for all Coloradans and to honor his unique contributions to CU-Colorado Springs, the CU Board of Regents presents Joseph Petta with the University Medal.

**UNIVERSITY MEDAL
RICHARD WRIGHT**

RICHARD WRIGHT has volunteered his time and talents for the past two years as a key building block for the CU-Colorado Springs Athletic Department. As a member of the Athletics Department Advisory Council, Richard Wright has been instrumental in developing the membership of the department's supporters. He has led the fund-raising efforts and the scholarship campaign for the CU-Colorado Springs Student Athletes.

He co-chaired the Seventh Annual Gold Golf Classic in 1994 and raised more than \$30,000 for the department, and his efforts have helped the Gold athletic teams become academically strong and competitive.

Richard Wright is the general manager of Pikes Peak Distributing, which also has been a major financial contributor to the athletic program. In addition, Richard Wright is involved in the Colorado Springs community through his work with the Boys and Girls Club Board, and the Pikes Peak Sertoma Club.

He is a 1973 graduate of the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, and has continually supported the university.

Because of his tireless work on behalf of the CU-Colorado Springs athletic department and in recognition of his service throughout the community, it is most fitting that the CU Board of Regents awards Richard Wright the University Medal.

**DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD
LAURIE LEE MAXSON**

LAURIE LEE MAXSON is involved in the activities of the Special Education program at CU-Colorado Springs. After earning her master's degree in Special Education, she put what she had learned in graduate school at CU-Colorado Springs to work to improve transition opportunities for students with disabilities. She became one of the first transition coordinators in Colorado to help students with disabilities make the transition to adulthood. She has helped write and implement one of the first districtwide transition policies in the country that made self-determination a central part of the process of educating students with disabilities.

She assisted the CU-Colorado Springs School of Education in writing a federal proposal to the U.S. Department of Education to develop the methodology to teach students with disabilities to become self-determined. Her field-based knowledge and experience played an invaluable role in the successful implementation of the project.

Because her collaborative efforts have benefitted the School of Education, her community, and countless students, the CU Board of Regents is honored to present Laurie Lee Maxson with the Distinguished Service Award.

THE PRESIDENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE

The Presidential Chain of Office was created in 1980 by Mary Sartor, M.F.A., University of Colorado, Boulder, for the inauguration of President Arnold R. Weber. The Chain was a gift to the University by Mr. and Mrs. David G. Hawthorn, Class of '24.

Colorado gold and silver are used throughout the chain to symbolize the importance of those minerals to the history of the State. The gem stones chosen also consist entirely of minerals from Colorado.

Three pendants are suspended on the chain. The back pendant is the Seal of the State of Colorado surrounded by a golden ribbon representing the golden Circle of Knowledge. The top pendant in the front, the Seal of the University of Colorado surmounted by an arch set with diamond and topaz signifies the necessary link between the search for knowledge and its practical application to the world outside the University. The Seal is supported at the bottom by the laurel wreaths found in the Seal, emblematic of honor and success.

The bottom pendant is centered with a golden topaz indicating man's quest for knowledge. The surrounding ring is paved with fragmented cubes and diamonds which suggest fragments of knowledge with brilliant breakthroughs of understanding.

The chain surrounding these pendants symbolize the endless but ever-changing cycle of human knowledge.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL

The University of Colorado has used three seals in its lifetime.

The present seal, adopted in 1908, depicts a classical Greek male figure seated against a pillar and holding a scroll. A burning torch framed in laurel is placed beside him. The Greek inscription means "Let your light shine."

According to Denver designer Henry Reed, the classical design was used because Greek civilization "stands as the criterion of culture." The laurel symbolizes honor or success, the youth of the figure suggests the "morning of life," and the scroll represents written language.

From 1893 to 1908, a seal was used which copies Wyon's medallion, "Science Trims the Lamp of Life." The classical figure of a kneeling Greek woman was flanked by mariposa lilies, which President Baker described as "a true Colorado flower."

Before 1893, a seal was used which essentially copies the Colorado state seal. It was never adopted by the Regents.

The official seal of the University of Colorado is used only by the Regents in transmitting official business.

THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the baccalaureate address by President George Norlin, of the University of Colorado, June 1935.)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather, it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the buildings on the campus, nor the faculties, not the students of any one time - not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you

go, the University goes with you. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

"What the University proposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas - a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is the darkness! But if it shine in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship, I bid you farewell only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cope or mantle which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and in style of cap, gown and hood developed. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress. Today, the black gown, hood, and mortar board worn by the graduates in most institutions follow this code.

While it is not apparent to the casual observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipient are square at one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet, and facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who receive a master's or a doctoral degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctoral candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, is black and has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. Candidates for the baccalaureate degree wear the tassel pendant over the right front of the cap before the degree is conferred, then it is worn on the left side. *Summa Cum Laude* and special honors candidates will wear gold honor cords.
