HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS YUSEF KOMUNYAKAA

YUSEF KOMUNYAKAA is one of the most distinguished writers of his generation and a poet of very great power. In 1994, his book, *Neon Vernacular*, was the recipient of the 1994 Pulitzer Prize for poetry. His poems have been described as so technically accomplished that, as Yeats said poetry must do, they "seem a moment's thought" and touch us with the power of spontaneous utterance.

After a decorated tour of military service in Vietnam, Yusef Komunyakaa earned his bachelor's degree in English at CU-Colorado Springs and graduated *magna cum laude* in 1975. While at CU-Colorado Springs, Komunyakaa helped found the student newspaper, called *Montage*, and the campus literary magazine *Riverrun*. He began his master's degree at Colorado State University where his master's thesis, a collection of original poems titled, *Lost In The Bonewheel Factory*, was published and was a finalist for the Elliston Book Award in 1979. He received a master of fine arts degree from the University of California-Irvine in 1980 and began a teaching and writing career that rose from an instructorship at the University of New Orleans to a professorship at the University of Indiana and to the Holloway Visiting Professorship at the University of California-Berkeley.

Year after year, a steady stream of poetry earned the highest admiration of America's most distinguished poets. He wrote Magic City, Dien cai Dau, Dedications and Other Dark Horses, Copacetic, I Apologize for the Eyes in My Head, and he edited such important works as The Jazz Poetry Anthology.

Robert Hass, Poet Laureate of the United States wrote: Yusef Komunyakaa is a writer who has quietly gone his own way, not cashed in on literary fashion, and made a sustained and disciplined body of work that brings a new voice to African American writing and a powerful moral intelligence to the English language for all of us.

Yusef Komunyakaa's poems have been translated into six languages. He has brought forth in his poems evidence of a unique human sensibility.

For his literary achievements and for the recognition his work has brought to Colorado, the University of Colorado Board of Regents takes this opportunity to honor Yusef Komunyakaa by awarding him the degree Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

UNIVERSITY MEDAL STEPHEN G. BACH

STEPHEN G. BACH of the Bach Real Estate Group, Inc., in Colorado Springs is a highly respected businessman and leader in Colorado Springs. Flo Carris has launched three substantial organizations - Pikes Peak Hospice, Inc., the Hospital Chaplaincy Volunteer Program, and the Colorado Springs Alzheimer Steering Committee (now a chapter of the Rocky Mountain Alzheimer's Association). She also was a prime mover behind the local state-of-the-art Namaste Alzheimer Center which uses innovative environmental design and staffing to enrich the lives of persons with Alzheimer's disease.

She has consistently tried to identify a need that others would not see or be willing to address. In each case, the development of the organization was a "cutting edge" idea that served ill persons and their families. Flo Carris has a compassion for persons facing the tragedies of life. Her compassion is matched only by her courage to step out and try to ease their suffering. She has both the tenacity and patience to work collaboratively with other volunteers and professionals to develop a range of services.

Those who have worked in one or more of her ventures have developed the utmost respect for her generosity, deep caring, willingness to give of herself above and beyond others' expectations, and generally gracious style of interacting with others.

For offering significant volunteer service to 30 organizations in Colorado Springs and in particular for offering visionary leadership to launch three major service organizations and provide leadership in many more, it is with deep gratitude that the University of Colorado Board of Regents presents the Distinguished Service Award to Flo Carris.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD WILLIAM J. HYBL

WILLIAM J. HYBL, chairman and chief executive officer of El Pomar Foundation, has been instrumental in several projects and programs that have directly or indirectly benefited the lives of every Coloradan. His involvement with the Olympic movement brought him national and international prominence which he still enjoys today. William Hybl is one of the great leaders in Colorado Springs and a good friend of the University of Colorado.

El Pomar Foundation is the largest foundation in the Rocky Mountain West, making grants for education, health care, the environment, amateur sports, human services, and the arts with special emphasis on excel-

lence in nonprofit organizations.

William Hybl has served as the president of the U.S. Olympic Committee, and in 1972-73, he was a member of the Colorado House of Representatives where he served as vice chairman of the House Judiciary Committee.

He graduated from Colorado College in 1964 and then graduated from the University of Colorado Law School in 1967.

Currently, he serves on the Chancellor's Roundtable for CU-Colorado Springs. He was instrumental in arranging a \$3.15 million gift to the University for three endowed chairs and the founding of the Colorado Institute for Technology Transfer and Implementation at CU-Colorado Springs.

DENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE

The Presidential Chain of Office was created in 1980 by Mary Santor, M.F.A., University of Colorado, Boulder, for the santor, M.F.A., University Arnold R. Weber. The Seal is supported at the bottom by the laurel wreaths found in the Seal, emblematic of honor and success.

The bottom pendant is centered with a golden topaz indicating man's quest for knowledge. The surrounding ring is paved with fragmented cubes and diamonds which suggest fragments of knowledge with brilliant breakthroughs of understanding.

The chain surrounding these pendants symbolizes the endless but ever-changing cycle of human knowledge.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL

The University of Colorado has used three seals in its lifetime.

The present seal, adopted in 1908, depicts a classical Greek male figure seated against a pillar and holding a scroll. A burning torch framed in laurel is placed beside him. The Greek inscription means "Let your light shine."

According to Denver designer Henry Reed, the classical design was used because Greek civilization "stands as the criterion of culture." The laurel symbolizes honor or success, the youth of the figure suggests the "morning of life," and the scroll represents written language.

From 1893 to 1908, a seal was used which copies Wyon's medallion, "Science Trims the Lamp of Life." The classical figure of a kneeling Greek woman was flanked by mariposa lilies, which President Baker described as "a true Colorado flower."

Before 1893, a seal was used which essentially copies the Colorado state seal. It was never adopted by the Regents.

The official seal of the University of Colorado is used only by the Regents in transmitting official business.

THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the baccalaureate address by President George Norlin, of the University of Colorado, June 1935.)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather, it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the buildings on the campus, nor the faculties, not the students of any one time - not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who

come into and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you go, the University goes with you. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

"What the University proposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas - a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is the darkness! But if it shine in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship, I bid you farewell only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cape or mantle which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and in style of cap, gown and hood developed. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress. Today, the black gown, hood, and mortar board worn by the graduates in most institutions follow this code.

While it is not apparent to the casual observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipient are square at one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet, and facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who receive a master's or a doctoral degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctoral candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, is black and has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. Candidates for the baccalaureate degree wear the tassel pendant over the right front of the cap before the degree is conferred, then it is worn on the left side. Summa Cum Laude and special honors candidates will wear gold honor cords.
