HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS DAVID P. CAMPBELL

David P. Campbell is a world-renowned scholar who has made many substantial contributions to the fields of organizational psychology, vocational assessment, leadership and creativity. He had a part in developing assessment instruments including the Strong-Campbell Interest Inventory and Campbell Leadership Index, that are currently in worldwide use. Under his guidance the Center for Creative Leadership developed and grew into a premier leadership training institution.

His educational and professional activities have taken him around the globe many times in the past forty years, notably to Russia, China, Peru, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, and most of Western Europe. Establishing his reputation as an outstanding scholar and respected scientist, he has become a significant presence in dozens of U.S. corporations and universities. High school counselors using his tests to help students and university professors

teaching guidance and leadership instantly recognize his name.

The Center for Creative Leadership is recognized in the U.S. and overseas as the foremost provider of leadership training for managers at all levels, and David P. Campbell must be accorded credit for this. He continues to be a prime mover in development of the center, starting with his appointment as a visiting fellow, continuing with his assignment as vice president for research and programs, and later taking the position of executive vice president.

In addition to dozens of professional publications, David P. Campbell is the author of the popular books, "If You Don't Know Where You're Going, You'll Probably End Up Somewhere Else," "Take the Road to Creativity

and Get Off Your Dead End," and "If I'm in Charge Here, Why is Everybody Laughing?"

For his superior achievements and significant contributions to his field, and to acknowledge the impact he has made in leadership and education, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is pleased to have the opportunity to award David P. Campbell the degree Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa.

UNIVERSITY MEDAL MORGAN BERTHRONG, M.D.

Morgan Berthrong, M.D., is an eminent pathologist and medical educator in Colorado Springs and Denver. A man of integrity, dedication and knowledge, he is a long-time contributor to the education and training of medical students, graduate students and pathology residents at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. Over a period of time involving almost his entire professional life, he has furthered the cause of medical education with great passion and enthusiasm. He has been supportive to the Colorado Springs campus in two roles, as a guest lecturer in biology classes and as a neighbor in the Cragmor area of Colorado Springs.

Morgan Berthrong's expertise as a pathologist is renowned throughout the region, garnering respect and praise from colleagues. No small number of medical professionals learned from his instruction and inspiration.

As acting chairman of the Department of Pathology in the University of Colorado Medical School 1959-1961, he recognized a major responsibility in passing skills and knowledge to the next generation of physicians. Since then he served as the Clinical Professor at the university, maintaining an active teaching schedule on a weekly basis until the mid 1980s.

During that time, Morgan Berthrong would hold weekly autopsy conferences where residents from the various hospitals in the program would present him with complex autopsy cases; it was a challenge for the residents to try to find an unknown case that would pose a puzzle to him. Most of the time, however, Dr. Berthrong would figure out the disease process without clinical history.

He postponed his retirement from pathology, only gradually cutting back his duties. He still holds regular conferences with pathology residents at Penrose Hospital in Colorado Springs.

In recognition of his achievements and contributions, for the honor his work has brought to the community, and for the lasting impression he has made on eager young scientific minds, the University of Colorado Board of Regents takes great pride in presenting Dr. Morgan Berthrong with the University Medal.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD A. MARVIN STRAIT

A. Marvin Strait is recognized as a national leader in the field of public accountancy. He is also known as a selfless contributor of his expertise to the areas of health care, education, fine arts and athletics. He is considered a man of insight, high ethical standards, and great regard for others.

His work in support of the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, the Economic Development Corporation and numerous political campaigns has earned him local recognition and reflected a passion to shape the future. Often remaining behind the scenes, A. Marvin Strait has shown himself willing to raise money for worthy causes, roll up his sleeves to accomplish hard work, and to lead the charge when necessary, to make his community

prosper and grow.

Currently a member of the Audit Committee of the United States Olympic Committee, Mr. Strait is no stranger to community service. He has been Chairman of the Board of the Colorado Springs Chamber of Commerce, and on the St. Francis Hospital Board of Directors, the Colorado Springs Utilities Financial Advisory Board, and the Penrose-St. Francis Healthcare Audit Committee. He is presently the Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee for the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center, and a member of the Board of Directors for Western National Bank.

In the early part of this decade, Fort Carson was being considered for closure; A. Marvin Strait came forward to lead a fund-raising effort that allowed the Chamber of Commerce to send a message to Washington's decision-makers. The importance of the post to this region's economy and to national defense were emphasized through the efforts he orchestrated. This is only one example of his tireless support and concern for the region.

For his invaluable contributions to so many regional institutions, and in gratitude for his many hours of unselfish service to the community of Colorado Springs, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is proud to recognize A. Marvin Straight with the university's Distinguished Service Award.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD KATHERINE H. LOO

Katherine H. Loo is a recognized and respected community leader. Her expertise, experience, foresight, and fund-raising skills have made her a prized addition to numerous community organizations. Well-known for giving freely of her time, talent and financial resources, she represents a unique spirit that enriches us all. Her service to the region for nearly four decades has included leadership in the Junior League of Colorado Springs, as its president; membership on the Colorado Springs City Council; serving as president of the Headstart Advisory Board and as a member of the Colorado Springs Urban Renewal Board. honorary trustee of the Zoo Board of Directors.

Our state came to know Katherine H. Loo as well: she served on the Colorado Commission of Higher Education and as a founder and board member of the Colorado Women's Foundation. A past president and board member of the Women's Forum of Colorado, she was also a member of the Colorado Women's Leadership Coalition.

If Katherine H. Loo is a woman of service, she is no less a woman of talent; she is an accomplished composer and pianist who recently released a soundtrack of her work. She is also a weaver who started a business featuring her custom designed textiles.

Her relationship with the University of Colorado has been prominent: as a student in continuing education programs and more so as a member of the CU-Colorado Springs Chancellor's Roundtable. She and her husband Lester have been major financial supporters of the TheatreWorks program at CU-Colorado Springs.

Her many contributions have enhanced the quality of life throughout the Pikes Peak Region and the University of Colorado Board of Regents is proud to present Katherine H. Loo with the Distinguished Service Award.

THE PRESIDENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE

The Presidential Chain of Office was created in 1980 by Mary Sartor, M.F.A., University of Colorado, Boulder, for the inauguration of President Arnold R. Weber. The chain was a gift to the University by Mr. and Mrs. David G. Hawthorn, Class of '24.

Colorado gold and silver are used throughout the chain to symbolize the importance of those minerals to the history of the state. The gem stones chosen also consists entirely of minerals from Colorado.

Three pendants are suspended on the chain. The back pendant is the Seal of the State of Colorado surrounded by a golden ribbon representing the golden Circle of Knowledge. The top pendant in the front, the Seal of the University of Colorado surmounted by an arch set with diamond and topaz, signifies the necessary link between the search for knowledge and its practical application to the world outside the University. The Seal is supported at the bottom by the laurel wreaths found in the Seal, emblematic of honor and success.

The bottom pendant is centered with a golden topaz indicating man's quest for knowledge. The surrounding ring is paved with fragmented cubes and diamonds which suggest fragments of knowledge with brilliant breakthroughs of understanding.

The chain surrounding these pendants symbolized the endless but ever-changing cycle of human knowledge.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL

The University of Colorado has used three seals in its lifetime.

The present seal, adopted in 1908, depicts a classical Greek male figure seated against a pillar and holding a scroll. A burning torch framed in laurel is placed beside him. The Greek inscription means "Let your light shine."

According to Denver designer Henry Reed, the classical design was used because Greek civilization "stands as the criterion of culture." The laurel symbolizes honor or success, the youth of the figure suggests the "morning of life," and the scroll represents written language.

From 1893 to 1908, a seal was used which copies Wyon's medallion, "Science Trims the Lamp of Life." The classical figure of a kneeling Greek woman was flanked by mariposa lilies, which President Baker described as "a true Colorado flower."

Before 1893, a seal was used which essentially copies the Colorado state seal. It was never adopted by the Regents.

The official seal of the University of Colorado is used only by the Regents in transmitting official business.

THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the baccalaureate address by President George Norlin, of the University of Colorado, June 1935)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise denotes not your severance from her, but your union with her. Commencement does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into the fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the buildings on the campus, nor the faculties, nor the students of any one time - not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

"What the University purposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas - a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is its darkness! But it if it shine in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship. I bid you farewell on only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cape or mantle which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and in style of cap, gown and hood developed. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress. Today, the black gown, hood, and mortar board worn by the graduates in most institutions follow this code.

While it is not apparent to the casual observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipients are square at

one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet, and facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who receive a master's or a doctoral degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctoral candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, is black and has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. Candidates for the baccalaureate degree wear the tassel pendant over the right front of the cap before the degree is conferred, then it is worn on the left side. Summa Cum Laude and special honors candidates will wear gold honor cords.
