HONORARY DOCTOR OF SCIENCE NEAL F. LANE

Neal F. Lane is a renowned physicist and educator, and one of those unique individuals who qualify for an honorary degree in all three categories of intellectual achievement, university service and public service.

Author or co-author of nearly 100 publications, his scientific accomplishments are indicated by his standing as a Fellow of the American Physical Society. He played a nationally prominent role as Director of the National Science Foundation 1993-1998, and most recently has been Presidential Science Advisor and Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy.

His continued effort in shaping and directing national research policy has not only been service to our country, but to society in general. Firmly believing in an essential link between scientific research and education, he has never missed the opportunity to remind researchers and the public that education thrives "in an atmosphere of inquiry and discovery."

An academic leader, he was twice awarded Rice University's George R. Brown Prize for Superior Teaching. He returned to that institution in 1986 to serve as Provost for eight years, after a brief time as Chancellor of the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs.

His time at the helm of CU-Colorado Springs was only for one and one-half years, but fondly remembered. An unassuming and unpretentious individual, he truly cared about people, making the time to talk to them and more importantly, to listen. He recognized the different needs of the various constituencies, doing what he felt was right and fair in working for the betterment of the university. His loyalty, honesty and integrity earned him respect across the campus.

Neal Lane never strayed far from his role as a scientist. CU-Colorado Springs faculty were impressed that their chief administrator continued to be involved with his chosen field. He found the time to collaborate with other researchers and to contribute scholarly work to the physics community.

For significant achievements in his field and continued service to humanity, and acknowledging his impact on research, education and leadership, the University of Colorado Board of Regents is pleased to award Neal F. Lane the degree Doctor of Science, *honoris causa*.

UNIVERSITY MEDAL F. LAMAR KELSEY

F. Lamar Kelsey, one of his colleagues said, has left an indelible handprint on the UCCS campus. This can't be denied, considering he prepared the very first master plan for the Colorado Springs Center for the University of Colorado, as the campus was then known, and played an active role in the design review process for the Housing Village, Columbine Hall, the Campus Services Building and Family Development Center. His 55-year career in architecture included involvement with the University of Colorado, and much of it with the Colorado Springs campus.

A practicing architect from 1952 to 1988, he spent most of that time as president of the LKA Partners (originally Lamar Kelsey Associates) in Colorado Springs. Since retiring, he has remained busy as an architectural consultant and volunteer, logging over 500 hours of service to UCCS in the summer of 1998. A Fellow of the American Institute of Architects, Lamar Kelsey is listed in Who's Who in America and Who's Who in the West. He is the coauthor of two books on design of educational facilities.

His accomplished career has included participation on the CU Design Review Board since 1965. In recent years his activities with UCCS have helped to make it the system's growth campus. A campus signage master plan, a conceptual campus development plan, University Center Expansion design, compilation of data for the master plan, and a detailed campus map digitized for computer use are some of the results of his tireless efforts. In addition to those many hours, he and his wife Ruth Ann donated \$30,000 for the purchase of a carillon to be installed in the new Library Communication and Technology Building.

In honor of his many contributions, and in deepest gratitude, the University of Colorado Board of Regents presents F. Lamar Kelsey with the University Medal.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RICHARD LOUIS PETRITZ

Richard Louis Petritz is recognized internationally as an innovative researcher and a pioneer in semiconductor technology. A founder of Mostek, Inmos and Simtek Corporations, he has often been called the dean of the Colorado Springs computer chip industry, bringing worldwide recognition to the region and strengthening the local economy.

An Elected Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, he has become a good friend of the CU Colorado Springs College of Engineering and Applied Science. He has shown generous support and interest in the college's students and programs. His support for the community through many civic activities and his leadership in the microelectronics field have had a positive impact on the region and made him a role model for UCCS engineering students.

Now recognized as an industry icon, Richard Petritz 'discovered early on that the transistor was the key to what would soon be the revolutionary integrated circuit. As a scientist at Texas Instruments, he was responsible for taking the first integrated circuit into production lines, eventually becoming manager of that firm's semiconductor research and development lab.

No one can say where Colorado Springs might be today if not for the microelectronics industry. No one can say where engineering might be today if not for semiconductor research. One can say, however, that Richard Petritz made a lasting impression on both.

He was recently selected among a handful of electrical engineering leaders to be featured in a "living history" interview for the Center for the History of Electrical Engineering. This is a man who created a considerable legacy.

Nothing less than a giant in his field, he has given decades of service that have enhanced the quality of life in the Pikes Peak Region and the quality of research in science and engineering. In recognition of his many contributions, the University of Colorado Board of Regents proudly presents Richard Louis Petritz with the Distinguished Service Award.

ALUMNI LEGISLATIVE AWARD KEITH KING

State Representative Keith C. King is a freshman legislator who has become well known at the Capitol in a short time. Colleagues have noted his capabilities and pegged him as a significant legislative leader in the future. As a member of the House Education Committee, he has been a staunch supporter of legislation that has helped the University of Colorado. He was instrumental in helping gain legislative support and funding for the

Main/Cragmor renovation project. On one occasion he attended a Capitol Development Committee meeting, although he is not a member, and spoke up strongly about the needs of the Colorado Springs campus. He talked of how important the Main/Cragmor project is to the history, and to the future, of CU-Colorado Springs. Later in that session, on the day the Joint Budget Committee (JBC) was taking the final vote on capital projects, he was told that Main/Cragmor was not yet on the list of approved projects.

Representative King left a group of 40 of his constituents at the Capitol and went to the JBC meeting where he sat and waited for over three hours until the UCCS project came up for a vote. He had earlier taken the time to talk to the JBC members individually, and made clear how important the Main/Cragmor renovations were. Ultimately, the project was the last one added to the approval list, passing on a 4-2 vote. The CU-Colorado Springs campus community has reason to be grateful. The Alumni and Friends Association would like to express its gratitude for Representative King's support for CU-Colorado Springs, and his commitment to our community and to higher education. For all he has done, we are pleased to present him with the 1999 Alumni Legislative Award.

THE PRESIDENTIAL CHAIN OF OFFICE

The Presidential Chain of Office was created in 1980 by Mary Sartor, M.F.A., University of Colorado, Boulder, for the inauguration of President Arnold R. Weber. The chain was a gift to the University by Mr. and Mrs. David G. Hawthorn, Class of '24.

Colorado gold and silver are used throughout the chain to symbolize the importance of those minerals to the history of the state. The gem stones chosen also consists entirely of minerals from Colorado.

Three pendants are suspended on the chain. The back pendant is the Seal of the State of Colorado surrounded by a golden ribbon representing the golden Circle of Knowledge. The top pendant in the front, the Seal of the University of Colorado surmounted by an arch set with diamond and topaz, signifies the necessary link between the search for knowledge and its practical application to the world outside the University. The Seal is supported at the bottom by the laurel wreaths found in the Seal, emblematic of honor and success.

The bottom pendant is centered with a golden topaz indicating man's quest for knowledge. The surrounding ring is paved with fragmented cubes and diamonds which suggest fragments of knowledge with brilliant breakthroughs of understanding.

The chain surrounding these pendants symbolized the endless but ever-changing cycle of human knowledge.

THE UNIVERSITY SEAL

The University of Colorado has used three seals in its lifetime.

The present seal, adopted in 1908, depicts a classical Greek male figure seated against a pillar and holding a scroll. A burning torch framed in laurel is placed beside him. The Greek inscription means "Let your light shine."

According to Denver designer Henry Reed, the classical design was used because Greek civilization "stands as the criterion of culture." The laurel symbolizes honor or success, the youth of the figure suggests the "morning of life," and the scroll represents written language.

From 1893 to 1908, a seal was used which copies Wyon's medallion, "Science Trims the Lamp of Life." The classical figure of a kneeling Greek woman was flanked by mariposa lilies, which President Baker described as "a true Colorado flower."

Before 1893, a seal was used which essentially copies the Colorado state seal. It was never adopted by the Regents.

The official seal of the University of Colorado is used only by the Regents in transmitting official business.

THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the baccalaureate address by President George Norlin, of the University of Colorado, June 1935)

the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise denotes not your severance from her, but your union with her. Commencement does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into the fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the buildings on the campus, nor the faculties, nor the students of any one time - not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into and go forth from her halls, who are touched by her

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

"What the University purposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas - a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is its darkness! But it if it shine in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship. I bid you farewell on only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."

The tradition of the academic costume began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cape or mantle which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity in color and in style of cap, gown and hood developed. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress. Today, the black gown, hood, and mortar board worn by the graduates in most institutions follow this code.

While it is not apparent to the casual observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed, while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipients are square at

one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet, and facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who receive a master's or a doctoral degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctoral candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, is black and has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. Candidates for the baccalaureate degree wear the tassel pendant over the right front of the cap before the degree is conferred, then it is worn on the left side. Summa Cum Laude and special honors candidates will wear gold honor cords.
